## One Board Meeting Summary

January 12, 2026

Good news! We ended the year with about the same amount in the budget as we started – approximately \$20,000.

Pastor Shannon proposed a new deaf ministry initiative in partnership with Deaf Independent Living Association (DILA) and she is interested in everyone's thoughts. If we like the idea, her friend Lynn could begin by interpreting worship services twice a month, starting with the first and third Sundays. The previous church in the area to offer this service lost their interpreter a couple of years ago and there is interest among the deaf population in finding a new church home.

The new camera system has been purchased and will soon be installed. We would like to have several people trained on its use.

We are getting bids for the installation of a WiFi enabled thermostat for the Sanctuary so it will be easier to adjust the temperature to a comfortable level by the start of the service.

We are getting a bid for an electronic sign for the front of the church.

There will be additional opportunities very soon if you would like to help clean out and organize some of the storage areas around the church. Next up will be the areas to the left and right of the altar.

Perhaps you will commit to attending services from now until the glory of Easter, including the Holy Week services, or dedicating a larger portion of your day to a time of prayer.

Whatever your personal preference, Lent can be the time when you decide to let go of old habits and develop a more joyful, Christ-filled way of living. I would like to invite you to join me as we prepare for a time of tremendous spiritual growth and renewal.
