HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE ONE BOARD MEETING - OCT. 14

Financial Status

- The balance in the Operating Budget at the end of September was \$8,854.23. We still have two large bills that will be due this year an insurance payment and an apportionment payment. Weekly donations continue to fall below the amount needed to fully meet our obligations. A successful Bazaar is critical for us to continue to have a positive balance. The good news is that we have not had to ask the Trustees for funds to cover operating expenses so far this year.
- The current balance of the Mid-Atlantic investment for the Endowment Fund is \$478,292 and the balance in the Trustees account is \$28,234. The bill to cover the recent water leak must still be paid.

Additional Business

- To help secure the building, a camera will be installed at the exit near the Men's Kitchen because that door has been left open several times recently and no one knows who is using it.
- To comply with requests from our new insurance company work days are being scheduled over the next several months to clean out/organize storage areas to ensure walkways are clear. We are also contacting foundation companies so the water issue in the basement is properly addressed.
- We are investigating the following:
 - o An electronic sign in front of the church
 - A new camera to video the service
 - Use of electronic giving in addition to traditional methods
 - A new photo directory
- We endorsed Pastor Shannon's ideas to:
 - o Form a Worship Committee
 - Hold a Leadership Retreat in January to ensure everyone on One Board understands their role and responsibilities
